Position: SENIOR CLAIMS ANALYST

Reports to: Director of Risk & Claims

FLSA Status: Exempt **Experience Level: Advanced**

Annual Salary: \$77,472 or higher depending on qualifications and experience.

<u>Nature of Work:</u> Assist the Director of Risk & Claims in the administration of the Pool's liability claims management program by handling the Pool's most complex, litigated claims brought against member counties.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Manage and monitor all liability claims and lawsuits that are assigned by the Director of Risk & Claims. Such claims may include those of the most complex nature experienced by the Pool.
- 2. Ensures claims are processed and managed in a manner consistent with established goals and objectives, and industry practice.
- 3. Interpret complex coverage issues and relay the same to the impacted member county.
- 4. Maintain liaison with reinsurers and excess carriers in administrating and reporting on appropriate losses.
- 5. Attend settlement conferences as required.
- 6. Handle and respond to specific inquires on large loss and complex liability claims.
- 7. Train and supervise support staff in the Deputy Director of Risk & Claims absence.
- 8. Select attorneys and/or independent adjusters to be assigned on claims or lawsuits.
- 9. Exercises independent judgment in analyzing complex insurance-legal problems, issues, and situations; develops and implements recommendations.
- 10. Review and approve legal billings and other invoicing for services and fees related to assigned claims and/or lawsuits.
- 11. As requested, prepare portions of newsletter dedicated to claims and underwriting.
- 12. Provide large loss reports and settlement authorization requests as required.
- 13. Assists member counties in the development and maintenance of their claims management programs and analyzes their effectiveness.
- 14. May be asked to plan, present and instruct at various training seminars and conferences.
- 15. Perform other functions as assigned.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- 1. Demonstrated ability in explaining, evaluating, negotiating, and settling large losses and complex liability claims and coverage issues.
- 2. Demonstrated problem solving and negotiation skills in managing large loss claims and complex insurance coverage issues.
- 3. Knowledge, skills and ability to make complex coverage decisions based on manuscript and ISO coverage documents with minimum supervision and relay same to member counties.
- 4. Excellent interpersonal, communication, and negotiation skills.

- 5. Proven ability to plan, organize and supervise the work of others.
- 6. Proven ability to establish and maintain cooperative and effective working relationships.
- 7. Flexibility to travel and work irregular hours.
- 8. Ability to keep sensitive and privileged information confidential.

Working Conditions and Physical Effort:

- 1. Work is normally performed in a typical interior/office work environment.
- 2. Position requires some overnight travel to member counties as necessary.
- 3. No or very limited physical effort required.
- 4. No or very limited exposure to physical risk.

Minimum Qualifications:

- 1. AA degree in business or public administration*, or AIC certification, <u>and</u> minimum of five (5) years of claims management experience of which three (3) years must include public sector claims management; <u>or</u> any combination of education and progressively responsible experience which would provide the applicant with a minimum of seven (7) years of education and progressively knowledgeable experience in claims management to possess ability to perform duties of job*.
- 2. Supervisory experience is desired.
- 3. One year of experience in computer claims management information systems.
- 4. A valid unrestricted (except vision) Washington State driver's license and a driving record meeting WCRP standards.
